

VESTRY SUMMARY JANUARY 8, 2024

- Our stewardship campaign brought in 65 pledges for a total of \$132, 333.
- The Elders have finished with staff evaluations and working on updating job descriptions.
- Sue Johannsen made a motion to increase the choir director's and bell choir director's pay to \$25/hour. Second by Dave Wangberg. Motion carried.
- We will continue with Lincoln Lawn Care as mowing prices will stay the same in 2024.
- We will continue with A+ Pest Solutions LLC, we appreciate working with the Ales family!
- Floors discussion Should we outsource carpet cleaning annually? Should we return to the issue of new flooring this year? There are places where the carpet needs to be cleaned and stretched. Some areas need some replacement. Dave will get estimates.
- The lighting replacement in the peak of the sanctuary will be put off until spring because of the cold weather and moving the lift in and out of the church.
- Kelley's Heating & Cooling scheduled spring installation rather than waiting until the fall.
- Pastor feels we should consider lowering the Advent wreath or taking it off the wall and making a standing base for it. Brainstorming to adjust the Advent wreath will continue.
- At Mark Butterworth's request, the Vestry voted yes on the use of Sharon Butterworth's memorial funds for lighting the sign on the brick wall outside the front doors of church.
- Need to secure an auditor for 2023 books Names were suggested, and will follow up.
- Fund for Future Leaders was approved for a Feb 11, 2024 special offering date.
