JULY PULPIT SUPPLY HIGHLIGHTS

Sunday, July 2 Fifth Sunday after Pentecost Jon Merritt with Communion

Scriptures: Romans 6:12-23, Psalms 13, and Matthew 10:40-42

Reflection: Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life." - John 4:13-14

Sunday, July 9 Sixth Sunday after Pentecost Rev. Marcy Heil

Scriptures: Ps 145:8-14 and Matt 11:16-19, 25-30

Reflection: One of the most comforting words of Jesus in all the four gospels is "Come to me . . . and I will give you rest." Anyone who feels tired, emotionally drained, disappointed, abandoned, or depressed can easily be uplifted by the comforting promise of Jesus that he will give rest. Will we take that wisdom of Jesus?

Sunday, July 16 Seventh Sunday after Pentecost Rev. Marcy Heil

Scriptures: Ps 65: 9-13 and Matt 13:1-9, 18-23

Reflection: Many people are not receptive to the Word because they find it irrelevant or that it runs counter to their worldviews and aspirations. Others are prevented from listening by personal factors such as their arrogance. They think they already know a lot and there is nothing more that they need to learn. Is that us sometimes?

Sunday, July 23 Eighth Sunday after Pentecost Rev. Brice Hughes

Scriptures: Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

Reflection: Humans have been asking questions about good and evil and our response since we took up language and thought. Author Stephen King said, "The battle between good and evil is endlessly fascinating because we are participants every day." You are invited to read the parable ahead of Sunday morning's service. Ponder for yourself: "How do you decide what is good, what is evil?" Where does evil come from, and what are we to do about it?

Sunday, July 30 Ninth Sunday after Pentecost Tom Emerick


Scriptures: Matt 13:24-30, 36-43.

"Love the sinner and hate the sin;" history has shown that it is the "sinner" rather than the sin that is usually ostracized, criticized, and even crucified. VESTRY NOTES FROM JUNE 12, 2023

Invited Guests: Sign Task Force Team, Scott offered the committee's recommendations on the new Church Sign proposal, and about branding, lighting, apps, security, and price. **Reports:**

Treasurer – May's Budget Report and Insurance Board Document explained. Deacons' – Fall schedule for Stewardship season. Tom Emerick will get the information. Elders' – Pulpit supply guidelines for additional documented and requested services, is \$30 per hour with travel expense reimbursement. Will review it again in 2024. Trustees' -Dave – will schedule Air Cond. and Furnace replacement with Kelly Inc. The bell tower is deteriorating. Dan Huss will look for the original plans of the church to find out if there is a steel interior. The bell tower had a date 1976 dedication on it.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>

Network upgrade to RNS standards – Rich signed the contract, and RNS started the process of updating the church technology, security, and networking operations.

New Business

Action Items:

- A motion to approve a proposal by the Sign committee, Seconded. Motion carried.
- Payment of the new office computer from the general fund. Motion carried.
- Air cond. & Furnace was approved for a congregational meeting. Motion carried.
- Request from John Elshoff to teach locally a Veterans Yoga Project yoga class for Veterans and First Responders, the class would be FREE at no charge for those attending the event at the church. A motion to approve, Seconded. **Motion carried**.

Non-Action Items:

- Discussion centered on potential changes in seating, conversation, discussion, entertainment, and a variety of worship opportunities. Some expressed a desire to get to know each other on a deeper level. Suggested we have a special meeting that would include all members in the discussion.
- A question arose about the departure from pulpit supply with Rev. Barb Muhs. Barb proposed the Vestry to hold office hours once school was over. The vestry reached out to the search & call committee and also the Associate Conference Minister Jonna Jensen. Jonna said having pulpit supply hold office hours was highly unlikely because of liability. The vestry offered Barb options of applying for the position of Interim Pastor or Part-time pastor. Barb Muhs declined both.
- Ways to help and support various committees, and volunteer needs in July and August.
- CE did a survey and decided from the results to change Wednesday night youth classes in the fall to 4:30-5:30 p.m. The church will not serve a meal, just a healthy snack, and then let the families go home to have dinner after class.
- Landmark Solar updated bid. Suggestions of a fundraiser drive be part of the plan, while others said we should finance the project from the Endowment.

Search & Call: 6/19 - Updated the profile of the church. Two new profiles! Pulpit Supply: Rev. Brice has agreed to be part of the team and will start July 23rd. Worship team: Sundays scheduled with Mike Morgan 6/18, Jon Merritt 7/2, Tom Emerick 7/30 ONA – Inherent Worth seminar will happen sometime in September. Sign Task Force: Will need to schedule a congregational meeting for Sign approval. Green team: Solar company comparable information was shared with vestry. Christian Education: Camp at Saulsbury. Beth & Deb to fix a meal on June 16th. Harmony Guild: Rummage sale Aug. 18 & 19. with donated items to be taken to basement. Friendship Circle: The new women's booklet for next year is to be finalized for fall. The Youth Group: The Musical Bingo event will be after worship on Sept. 10th. Cong. Care: Ingstad funeral luncheon on June 12th in memory of Kelly Ingstad. Outreach: The benevolent funds have been processed with payments to local outreach. Memorial: Committee purchased new "Reserved Cloths" for draping over the pews. Next meeting: Monday, July 10th at 6:30 p.m.


