The Congregational vote on August 13th, 2023, approved the covenant between Faith UCC and Pastor Paris White. She has signed her contract and is eager to get started.

Pastor Paris has now gotten settled into her office space and is working on learning the committees, people, and projects that Faith is well known for, and working on her sermons to bring us closer on our Faith journeys with God.



She will be working Monday – Thursday at the office most days between 10-4, (If you would like to meet outside of this time frame, call ahead so she can make sure to be at the church when you can both find time). If you would like to take her to coffee or lunch, please call ahead and she can plan for this as well.

VESTRY SUMMARY FROM AUGUST 14, 2023

Reports:

Treasurer – July's Budget Report and Endowment quarterly report. Year-to-date contributions are on target. The Endowment Report was presented.

Deacons - Meet with Rich Carroll for the 2024 Budget report.

Elders – Staff evaluations in September/October

Trustees'- The bell tower has a brick that can no longer be matched. Unless we can find

an off-the-shelf bell tower, we need to think about this topic. The topic of smoke

detectors was raised. Continued conversation is planned on this issue.

New Business

1. Action Items:

- A Fall cleanup day at the church is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 7, 8:00 a.m.
- Dave Air cond. & Furnace estimates for rooftop units. Kelly said the curbs will need to be replaced. The life expectancy of the three units on the roof is almost gone. Replacing the three units will cost an estimated \$150,000. It will take a crane, take at least three days, and should be planned for between seasons. Orders will take about 6 months to obtain the units. There was consensus of the Vestry to approve the new HVAC, but a congregational vote in the future will be needed to allocate the funds.
- Dan Clark will fix the garage door on the parsonage. Mike Morgan made a motion to fix it for \$530. Frantz second. **Motion carried.**
- Need to form a Congregational Life Grant Committee for the fall grants.
- Grant Requests:
 - 1. Church t-shirts could be considered.
 - 2. Families First to purchase Christmas gifts.
 - 3. C. E. Day Camp for youth supplies and background checks
 - 4. Halloween dance party for those with physical and mental disabilities.
 - 5. Compensation increases for Special music guests.
 - 6. Green Team is submitting a grant for radon kits
 - 7. Congregational Care Support
 - 8. Congregational gift card to Fire/Police
 - 9. Advent Outreach giving
 - 10. Crop Walk outreach giving
 - 11. Fall College Student's gift packages
- Research companies for a New Church Directory, the last one was in 2016.
- Joys and Prayers– encourage people to share concerns with a Vestry member.
- Offer: Muscatine Symphony Orchestra has programs with advertising. Motion carried.
- Need a Bylaw Committee: Congregational voting and covenant with pastor guidelines.
 Rev Jonna Jensen said it should match the vote needed to end a covenant. A
 committee needs to recommend these changes and be ready for the Annual Meeting
 in January. The discussion was tabled until we can talk to an attorney.



ONA Meeting Summary

ONA had a special guest at their meeting. Sue introduced Megan Francis, Marketing Director of Crossroads/Senior Resources. Megan explained that the two agencies have recently merged. She went on to share an overview of the services provided to over 200 Crossroads clients and over 500 Senior Resources clients. She and her team are very excited to move forward with a shared activity with our church. Their agency has recently identified a goal of promoting choice for their clients and inclusion in the wider community. Megan's team proposed a Halloween Dance for Crossroads clients and their family and friends emphasizing that the event be open for everyone. She said dances from 4:30 to 6:30 have been popular in the past. She recommended deejay Tony Tone, as well as The Rendezvous, both of which have been used in the past. The Rendezvous is accessible and Cindy Carver, a member of the church, has been very accommodating with reasonably priced snacks and light food options. Megan estimated attendance at 150-200. ONA will submit a Congregational Life Grant in the amount of \$500 to be used for a Halloween Dance for Crossroads clients and their families.

Green Team

The Green Team requested a Congregational Life Grant to procure radon kits from the Iowa Radon Hotline (run by the American Lung Association) They want to purchase 20 or more kits for about \$10 each. There will be a Zoom presentation for the congregation on Oct. 11 at 4:30 p.m. during the Christian Education hour to encourage parents to attend as well. Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering, October 1st

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion in the United States. As you may recall, one-third of the offering supports Council for American Indian



Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

Crop Walk
